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E. NOTES TO THE CONDENSED INTERIM CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

For the third quarter and nine months financial period ended 30 September 2025

1. Corporate information

The Company is a limited liability company incorporated and domiciled in Singapore and is listed on the Singapore Exchange Securities Trading Limited ("SGX-ST"). The registered office and principal place of business of the Company is located at 1 HarbourFront Place, HarbourFront Tower One, #07-02, Singapore 098633.

The principal activities of the Company were those of a trading company, investment holding, and exploration and production of oil and gas. The principal activities of the subsidiaries are:

- (a) Investment holding
- (b) Oil and gas exploration and production

2. Basis of preparation

The condensed interim financial statements for the third quarter and nine months financial period ended 30 September 2025 have been prepared in accordance with Singapore Financial Reporting Standards (International) ("SFRS(I)") 1-34 Interim Financial Reporting issued by the Accounting Standards Council Singapore. The condensed interim financial statements do not include all the information required for a complete set of financial statements. However, selected explanatory notes are included to explain events and transactions that are significant to an understanding of the changes in the Group's financial position and performance of the Group since the last annual financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2024.

The accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous financial year which were prepared in accordance with SFRS(I)s, except for the adoption of new and amended standards as set out in Note 2.1.

The condensed interim financial statements are presented in United States Dollar ("USD") which is the Company's functional currency and all values are rounded to the nearest thousand ("US\$'000") except when otherwise indicated.

2.1 New and amended standards adopted by the Group

The Group has adopted applicable SFRS(I) which became effective for the financial years beginning on or after 1 January 2025.

The adoption of the new/revised SFRS(I) did not result in any material impact of the Group's results.

2.2 Use of judgements and estimates (SFRS(I))

In preparing the condensed interim financial statements, management has made judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expense. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The significant judgements made by management in applying the Group's accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty were the same as those applied to the consolidated financial statements as at and for the year ended 31 December 2024.

Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimates are revised and in any future periods affected.

Significant changes in assumptions, estimations, and risks that will result in material adjustments to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities within the next interim period are included in the following notes:

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E. NOTES TO THE CONDENSED INTERIM CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (continued)

2. Basis of preparation (continued)

2.2 Use of judgements and estimates (SFRS(I)) (continued)

(a) Hydrocarbon reserve and resouce estimates

Oil and gas production properties are depreciated on units of production basis at a rate calculated by reference to total proved developed and undeveloped reserves determined in accordance with Society of Petroleum Engineers rules and incorporating the estimated future cost of developing those reserves. The Group estimates its commercial reserves based on information compiled by appropriately qualified persons relating to the geological and technical data on the size, depth, shape and grade of the hydrocarbon body and suitable production techniques and recovery rates. Commercial reserves are determined using estimates of oil and gas in place, recovery factors and future oil prices. Future development costs are estimated using assumptions as to number of wells required to produce the commercial reserves, the cost of such wells, associated production facilities, and other capital costs. The carrying amount of oil and gas development and production assets at 30 September 2025 and 31 December 2024 are shown in Note 9.

As the economic assumptions used may change and as additional geological information is obtained during the operation of a field, estimates of recoverable reserves may change. Such changes may impact the Group's reported financial position and results.

(b) Exploration and evaluation expenditures

The application of the Group's accounting policy for exploration and evaluation expenditure requires judgment to determine whether future economic benefits are likely from either future exploitation or sale, or whether activities have not reached a stage which permits a reasonable assessment of the existence of reserves. The determination of reserves and resources is, in itself, an estimation process that involves varying degrees of uncertainty depending on how the resources are classified. These estimates directly impact when the Group defers exploration and evaluation expenditure. The deferral policy requires management to make certain estimates and assumptions as to future events and circumstances, in particular, whether an economical viable extraction operation can be established. Any such estimates and assumptions may change as new information becomes available. If, after expenditure is capitalised, information becomes available suggesting that the recovery of the expenditure is unlikely, the relevant capitalised amount is written off in profit or loss in the period when the new information becomes available.

(c) Recoverability of oil and gas assets

The Group assesses each asset or cash generating unit ("CGU") (excluding goodwill, which is assessed annually regardless of indicators) at each reporting period to determine whether any indicationof impairment exists. The Group treats both the Kepala Burung Production Sharing Contract ("PSC") and Salawati PSC ("Salawati Group CGU") as a single CGU for the purposes of impairment assessment. Where an indicator of impairment exists, a formal estimate of the recoverable amount is made, which is considered to be the higher of fair value less costs of disposal and value in use. These assessments require the use of estimates and assumptions such as long-term oil prices (taking into account current and historical prices, price trends and related factors), discount rates, production and sales volumes, operating costs, future capital requirements, decommissioning costs and exploration potential. These estimates and assumptions are subject to risk and uncertainty. Therefore, there is a possibility that changes in circumstances may result in deviation from these projections, which may in turn impact on the recoverable amount of the assets and/or CGUs.

(d) Decommissioning costs

Decommissioning costs will be incurred by the Group at the end of the operating life of some of the Group's facilities and properties. The Group assesses its decommissioning provision at each reporting date. The ultimate decommissioning costs are uncertain and cost estimates can vary in response to many factors, including changes to relevant legal requirements, the emergence of new restoration techniques or experience at other production sites. The expected timing, extent and amount of expenditure can also change, for example, in response to changes in reserves or changes in laws and regulations or their interpretation. Therefore, significant estimates and assumptions are made in determining the provision for decommissioning. As a result, there could be significant adjustments to the provisions established which would affect future financial results. The provision at reporting date represents management's best estimate of the present value of the future decommissioning costs required.

3. Seasonal operations

The Group's businesses are not affected significantly by seasonal or cyclical factors during the financial period.

Third quarter period ended 30 September 2025 ("3Q 2025") vs third quarter period ended 30 September 2024 ("3Q 2024")

- 6.1.1. The Group recorded revenue of US\$19,469,000 for 3Q 2025, a decrease of 13.8% as compared to the US\$22,589,000 recorded for 3Q 2024. The decrease was mainly attributed to a 14.1% decrease in the average realised oil price from US\$78 per barrel in 3Q 2024 to US\$67 per barrel in 3Q 2025, as well as lower volume of crude oil lifted in the Kepala Burung and Salawati production sharing contracts ("**PSC**").
- 6.1.2. The gross production for 3Q 2025 was 6,486 barrels of oil equivalent per day ("BOEPD"), decrease of 6.6% as compared to 6,945 BOPED for 3Q 2024. The lower production was primarily attributable to the shutdown of a number of high productivity wells as a result of power outages.
- 6.1.3. The cost of sales decreased by 14.3% from US\$14,867,000 in 3Q 2024 to US\$12,747,000 in 3Q 2025, which is mainly due to i) decrease in equipment leasing and third-party services for field operations; (ii) lower repair and maintenance costs for plant and machinery; and (iii) lower utilisation of materials for well workovers and well services. This was partially offset by i) higher marine transportation costs; and ii) increased in depletion and amortisation of oil and gas properties.
- 6.1.4. As a result of the decrease in revenue and partially offset by the lower cost of sales as explained above, the gross profit decreased from US\$7,722,000 in 3Q 2024 to US\$6,722,000 in 3Q 2025.
- 6.1.5. Other income increased from US\$563,000 in 3Q 2024 to US\$1,222,000 in 3Q 2025 mainly due to higher interest income from fixed deposits placed with the banks and higher foreign exchange gains.
- 6.1.6. Administrative expenses for 3Q 2025 increased marginally as compared to 3Q 2024 mainly due to an increase in (i) staff cost; and (ii) other monthly overheads. This was partially offset by decrease in professional fees and the absence of share-based payment.
- 6.1.7. Other expenses increased significantly in 3Q 2025 mainly due to the write-off of exploration and evaluation assets of US\$7,512,000 in relation to the costs incurred for the acquisition and processing of a 3D seismic survey conducted in the Salawati PSC offshore work area. Please refer to the Company's SGXNET Announcement No. SG2510310THRA3OG dated 31 October 2025 for more details.
- 6.1.8. Finance costs for 3Q 2025 were higher as compared to 3Q 2024 mainly due to higher interest expense on lease liabilities for both the Kepala Burung and Salawati PSCs.
- 6.1.9. In line with the decrease in gross profit, the income tax expense decreased from US\$3,069,000 in 3Q 2024 to US\$2,900,000 in 3Q 2025. The income tax expense of US\$2,900,000 in 3Q 2025 comprised (i) the Group's share of the income tax expense of US\$2,563,000 for both the Kepala Burung and Salawati PSCs; and (ii) reversal of deferred tax assets of US\$337,000 for the Kepala Burung PSC.
- 6.1.10. As a result of the above, the Group recorded a net loss of US\$3,768,000 and EBITDAX (Section E Note 6.2 above) of US\$7,582,000 for 3Q 2025 as compared to a net profit of US\$3,912,000 and EBITDAX of US\$7,399,000 for 3Q 2024.

Nine months financial period ended 30 September 2025 ("9M 2025") vs nine months period ended 30 September 2024 ("9M 2024")

- 6.1.11. The Group recorded revenue of US\$58,740,000 for 9M 2025, a decrease of 17.0% as compared to the US\$70,776,000 recorded for 9M 2024. The decrease was mainly attributable to a decrease of 14.8% in the average realised oil price from US\$81 per barrel in 9M 2024 to US\$69 per barrel in 9M 2025, as well as lower volume of crude oil lifted in the Kepala Burung and Salawati PSCs.
- 6.1.12. The gross production for 9M 2025 was 6,570 barrels of oil equivalent per day ("**BOEPD**"), decrease of 6.8% as compared to 7,052 BOPED for 9M 2024. The lower production was primarily attributable to the shutdown of a number of high productivity wells as a result of power outages.
- 6.1.13. The cost of sales decreased by 12.8% from US\$43,451,000 in 9M 2024 to US\$37,895,000 in 9M 2025, which was mainly due to (i) decrease in equipment leasing and third-party services for field operations; (ii) overall reduction in number of well workovers and well services ("WOWS") as well as lower utilisation of materials for WOWS; and (iii) lower repair and maintenance costs for plant and machinery. This was partially offset by an increase in (i) marine transportation costs; and (ii) depletion and amortisation of oil and gas properties.
- 6.1.14. As a result of the decrease in revenue and partially offset by the lower cost of sales as explained above, the gross profit decreased from US\$27,325,000 in 9M 2024 to US\$20,845,000 in 9M 2025.
- 6.1.15. Other income increased from US\$1,890,000 in 9M 2024 to US\$3,025,000 in 9M 2025, mainly due to reversal of the provision for legal compensation of US\$984,000 (see paragraph 6.1.17 below) following the conclusion of the judicial review which ruled in favour of Petrogas (Basin) Ltd, reversing an earlier Supreme Court verdict over a land dispute initiated by the plaintiff. Please refer to the Company's SGXNET Announcement No. SG250701OTHRQOCM dated 1 July 2025 for more details. The increase was also partially due to higher interest income from fixed deposits placed with the banks and higher foreign exchange gains.

The reversal was partially offset by the absence of the distribution of US\$417,000 by the joint venture to the Group in relation to the expired Island PSC which was recorded in the previous corresponding period.

- 6.1.16 Administrative expenses decreased by 3.1% from US\$3,055,000 in 9M 2024 to US\$2,960,000 in 9M 2025 mainly attributed to (i) decrease in share-based payment; (ii) professional fees; and (iii) staff costs.
- 6.1.17.Other expenses increased significantly in 9M 2025 mainly due to the write-off of exploration and evaluation assets of US\$7,512,000 in relation to the costs incurred for the acquisition and processing of a 3D seismic survey conducted in the Salawati PSC offshore work area. Please refer to the Company's SGXNET Announcement No. SG251031OTHRA3OG dated 31 October 2025 for more details.

This was partially offset by the absence of the provision for legal compensation of US\$984,000 awarded by the Indonesian courts to an individual plaintiff who claimed to be the rightful landowner of a 7,500m2 plot and had not received any compensation for the land when it was acquired in 2001 by the previous operator of the expired Basin PSC. Please refer to the Company's SGXNET Announcement No. SG240606OTHRT6BL dated 6 June 2024 for more details. This provision has been reversed in the current financial period (see paragraph 6.1.15 above).

- 6.1.18. Finance costs for 9M 2025 were higher as compared to 9M 2024 mainly due to higher interest expense on lease liabilities for both the Kepala Burung and Salawati PSCs.
- 6.1.19. In line with the decrease in gross profit, the income tax expense decreased from US\$11,366,000 in 9M 2024 to US\$8,754,000 in 9M 2025. The income tax expense of US\$8,754,000 in 9M 2025 comprised (i) the Group's share of the income tax expense of US\$8,346,000 for both the Kepala Burung and Salawati PSCs; (ii) reversal of deferred tax assets of US\$402,000 for the Kepala Burung PSC; and (iii) under-provision of income tax expense of US\$6,000 in previous period.
- 6.1.20. As a result of the above, the Group recorded a net profit of US\$3,694,000 and EBITDAX (Section E Note 6.2 above) of US\$20,812,000 for 9M 2025 as compared to a net profit of US\$13,112,000 and EBITDAX of US\$26,002,000 for 9M 2024.

6.2. Balance Sheet

- 6.2.1 As at 30 September 2025, the carrying value of oil and gas properties includes assets retirement obligations of US\$1,365,000 for the Kepala Burung and Salawati PSCs.
- 6.2.2. The right-of-use ("ROU") assets mainly relate to lease contracts for office and warehouse, plant and machinery, motor vehicles and other equipment for both the Kepala Burung and Salawati PSCs. The decrease in ROU asset was mainly due to depreciation of ROU assets for both the Kepala Burung and Salawati PSCs. This was partially offset by the additional lease agreement entered into for the Kepala Burung PSC during the period.

- 6.2.3. The cash and bank balances under the non-current assets relate to deposits placed with the bank as collateral for the issuance of performance bonds in relation to both the Kepala Burung and Salawati PSCs. The increase in cash and bank balances was mainly due to the top-up in cash collateral for the 30-months extension of the firm work commitment period from 15 October 2025 to 14 April 2028 for the Kepala Burung PSC.
- 6.2.4. The decrease in exploration and evaluation assets was mainly due to the write-off of exploration and evaluation assets of US\$7,512,000 in relation to the costs incurred for the acquisition and processing of a 3D seismic survey conducted in the Salawati PSC offshore work area.
- 6.2.5. The increase in inventories was mainly due to parts purchased for plant and machinery in the Kepala Burung PSC.
- 6.2.6 The decrease in trade and other receivables was mainly attributable to the decrease in trade receivables, refundable deposits and under-lift assets for both the Kepala Burung and Salawati PSCs. Included in trade and other receivables was the sale and lifting of crude oil of US\$5,409,000 from both the Kepala Burung and Salawati PSCs in September 2025 with the proceeds received in October 2025.
- 6.2.7. The total lease liabilities decreased during the period due to payments made. This was partially offset by the addition of a new lease signed during the same period for the Kepala Burung PSC. As at 30 September 2025, the lease liabilities in the current liabilities and non-current liabilities were US\$4,702,000 and US\$2,084,000 respectively.
- 6.2.8. The decrease in trade and other payables was mainly attributable to the decrease in accrued operating expenses and sundry payables in both the Kepala Burung and Salawati PSCs. The decrease was also attributable to the reversal of provision for legal compensation (see paragraph 6.1.15 above).
- 6.2.9. The increase in provisions was due to the increase in defined benefit plan liabilities and partially offset by a decrease in the provision for decommissioning for both the Kepala Burung and Salawati PSCs.

6.3. Cash Flow

3Q 2025 vs 3Q 2024

- 6.3.1. The Group's net cash flows from operating activities decreased from US\$7,510,000 in 3Q 2024 to US\$6,776,000 in 3Q 2025. The decrease was mainly due to lower operating cash flows before changes in working capital and higher net working capital outflow.
- 6.3.2. Net cash flows used in investing activities was US\$8,406,000 in 3Q 2025. This comprised mainly (i) placement of short term deposits with maturity of more than 3 months of US\$6,514,000; (ii) additions to oil and gas properties of US\$931,000; and (iii) increase in deposits pledged of US\$800,000.
- 6.3.3. Net cashflows used in financing activities of US\$1,581,000 in 3Q2025 was related to the payment of lease liabilities for both Kepala Burung and Salawati PSCs.

9M 2025 vs 9M 2024

- 6.3.4. The Group recorded net cash flows from operating activities of US\$18,757,000 in 9M 2025 as compared to US\$25,574,000 in 9M 2024. The decrease was mainly due to lower operating cash flows before changes in working capital and higher net working capital outflow.
- 6.3.5. Net cash flow from investing activities was US\$5,121,000 in 9M 2025. This comprised mainly (i) additions to oil and gas properties of US\$1,337,000; (ii) the placement of short-term deposits with maturity more than 3 months of US\$1,183,000; (iii) additions to exploration and evaluation assets of US\$1,067,000 for both Kepala Burung and Salawati PSCs; and (iv) increase in deposits pledged of US\$775,000.
- 6.3.6. Net cashflows used in financing activities of US\$4,595,000 in 9M2025 was mainly related to the payment of lease liabilities of US\$4,681,000 for both Kepala Burung and Salawati PSCs. This was partially offset by the proceeds from issuance of 740,000 new ordinary shares of US\$86,000 pursuant to the exercise of options granted under the RHP Share Option Scheme 2011.
- 6.3.7. The Group recorded positive operating cash flows of US\$18,757,000 for 9M 2025 and has cash and bank balances of US\$66,807,000 as at 30 September 2025.

8. A commentary at the date of the announcement of the significant trends and competitive conditions of the industry in which the Group operates and any known factors or events that may affect the Group in the next operating period and the next 12 months

Brent crude prices traded in a relatively narrow range during the third quarter of 2025, averaging about US\$69 per barrel, broadly stable compared to the previous quarter. Market sentiment continued to be shaped by elevated geopolitical tensions, including the ongoing Russia-Ukraine and Israel-Hamas conflicts, and the sustained impact of Western sanctions on Russian crude. These factors helped offset concerns about increasing oil supply as OPEC+ continued with its plans to unwind previous production cuts. Towards the end of the quarter, benchmark oil prices softened slightly, mainly due to market expectation of higher global supply alongside signs of moderating demand growth amid renewed tensions between the United States and China. These developments contributed to more cautious sentiment among oil market participants.

In its October 2025's Oil Market Report, IEA maintained its forecast for global oil demand growths of 0.7 million barrels per day ("b/d") for both 2025 and 2026, while noting stronger supply driven by an increase in output from OPEC+ and non-OPEC+ producers. With demand growth remaining moderate, the agency expected crude inventories to continue building as supply outpaced consumption. On the other hand, OPEC held a more optimistic outlook and in its OPEC Monthly Oil Market Report for October 2025, the organization maintained its forecast for oil demand to grow by 1.3 million b/d in 2025 and by a slightly higher 1.4 million b/d in 2026. The different outlooks reflect ongoing uncertainties surrounding global economic conditions, trade policy, and geopolitical risks. Overall, the outlook remains subject to developments in conflict zones, sanctions policy, and broader macroeconomic trends.

Against this backdrop, the Group remains focused on managing its costs and executing its planned work programme. The Group is planning to commence the drilling of two exploration wells in the Kepala Burung PSC from the last quarter of 2025 on a back-to-back basis, with permitting and site preparation activities well advanced to support the planned drilling campaign.

No dividend has been proposed by the Board for the third quarter period ended 30 September 2025. Under the terms of the new Kepala Burung PSC and Salawati PSC which both commenced in 2020, the Group is committed to conduct an agreed set of exploration work programmes in the two blocks during the first five contract years, which carry a firm financial commitment of approximately US\$68.2 million net to the Group's working interests. For the Salawati PSC, the five-year period for the implementation of the firm work commitments has been extended by 16 months to 22 August 2026. For the Kepala Burung PSC, SKK Migas has endorsed a 30-month extension of the timeline to 14 April 2028 to the Minister of Energy & Mineral Resources for final approval. As of the date of this report, the Group had made progress towards the fulfilment of its exploration work commitment with the drilling of one exploration well and acquisition of an offshore 3D seismic survey in the Salawati PSC, as well as the drilling of two exploration wells and commencement of the enhanced oil recovery project in the Kepala Burung PSC. The financial commitment net to the Group's working interests for the remaining work programmes is approximately US\$40.2 million as at 30 September 2025.
